

“The Edge” Wednesday, February 24, 2010
The 1,000 Year Reign of Christ

Read [Revelation 20:1-10](#) together and answer the following questions.

1. Take a moment and review all the significant events that lead up to the 1,000 year reign of Christ (also called the Millennial Reign of Christ). Here’s a hint there are four major events that lead up to this point.
2. The dragon (the serpent of old, the Devil, or Satan) has been deceiving, causing pain, suffering, and death since the Garden of Eden. His power is great and many people believe that he even has power equal to that of God’s. Discuss what happens in verse’s 20:1-2.
3. Satan is bound by an angel for 1,000 years. Discuss what he can do from his prison of the bottomless pit during those 1,000 years.
4. In verse 3 Satan is released at the end of the 1,000 years. Talk about as a family why God would release Satan to come out and deceive the nations once again.
5. Who is it that is reigning with Christ in verse 4?
6. Discuss the first resurrection in verse 5. Who is resurrected at this time? Also discuss what is the “second death” mentioned in verse 6.
7. During the 1,000 year reign of Christ, it will be a time of peace and even the animals will be vegetarians. There will be many people born during this period. Discuss if these people that are born during the millennial reign will still need to receive salvation through Christ. Will everyone choose to receive Christ during this time? (see verse 8 and read [Jeremiah 17:9](#))
8. God and Satan are not on equal footing. Satan can do nothing that God does not allow him to do. God is big enough to use the evil of this world for His purposes. Discuss how this realization makes you feel?
9. What is Satan’s and those who chose to follow him ultimate ends? (see verses 9 & 10)
10. We don’t always get to see the promises of God fulfilled. We must trust Him by faith. Spend some time in prayer as family and ask Him to increase your faith and trust in Him. Thank Him for His immeasurable love for you!
